# 1. Workshops in multiethnic elementary schools

From October, we started with implementation of our project "Workshops for Macedonian children of various ethnic origins focused on the creation of workshops to improve the comprehension, tolerance and respect between children of various ethnic backgrounds". Equal in Development from Belgium finances this project. Our idea is to cover 15 preschool groups of children in 15 multiethnic elementary schools in the area of Skopje. The project is made of two components:

-first, through interactive and communicative games to acquaint the children with their rights and

-second, to provide the pedagogies in the schools to see the new methodology of learning that can improve their engagement in the civic society.

The coordinator of the project is Redjep Raimi who has long experience working as a teacher in elementary schools and trained facilitator for children's rights.

# 2. New Year at our Shelter

In December, we started with New Year preparation for displaced families who are still in our Shelter. They received wonderful donations and gift packages for children. The kids were especially happy.

### 3. Children's Workshops

As we mentioned in the last newsletter, the last four months, every working day, we organized two workshops in the area of English, German and French Language, art, computers, maths, and ecology. For the kids involved in workshops we prepared New Year surprise- gift packages, donation from Producer Kraft - Distributor NELTKO. After the winter holiday, in February we will continue with the workshops.

# 4. SOS Helpline

After a long time of voluntary work, Balkan Foundation for Children and Youths is financing this project. It will be established new phone line and will be provided better conditions for voluntary work. Further more, the competence of the volunteers will be improved by advising and trainings, as well as the services that can be useful for the children and youths in risk. Every year SOS makes Annual report. The results from 2002 show that 35% of the calls are personal, 25% are family, 15% love problems and the rest are about violence, health, school, sex and addiction problems.

From January, SOS helpline working hours are increased from 12:00 to 20:00 o'clock and the coordinator is present during the day in purpose phone line to be active and when is the need to make a direct contact with the callers.
